Castleman risk management



Castleman is aware that the NHS landscape, particularly the PCN Network DES is vastly different in terms of accountability and financial value now compared to what it was at the inception of PCNs some 4 years ago, therefore, as part of our ongoing governance process we are working with LMC Law to review all of our risk management documents to ensure that they are fit for purpose. A particular focus is on the risk sharing agreements between all practices within a PCN and the host practice for the PCN ARRS staff and the risk sharing agreement between the host practices and Castleman Healthcare for staff employed under the ICPCS contract. Once complete, a checklist of documents will be shared that outlines what is necessary for PCNs to have in place to ensure good governance and risk mitigation.


Castleman Service Updates



Diabetes support for Care Homes:

To support with educating care and residential homes in how to better care for diabetic residents, the Castleman DSN team will be offering regular education sessions for care home workers. This is a two hour session presented by one of the RSNs and accompanied by a best practice guidance document for the home to adopt. We also welcome the support of your care home leads to promote upskilling and awareness of their staff. More info to follow soon.

The Castleman DSN Team are also implementing diabetic care plans for residents to ensure that this information is readily available to carers and clinicians attending the home. We are starting small and will continue to offer this as a rolling programme through the year.



Respiratory:

Steph Norton, Castleman RSN, is currently working alone until November when she will be joined by an additional RSN and an HCA. This has presented an opportunity to pilot diagnostics back in the practices and review the Standard Operating Procedure. An updated SOP will be shared soon and we will return to St Leonards to maximise the space once the RSN and HCA have started.

Working with the Dorset General Practice Alliance

Castleman is continuing to support the Dorset General Practice Alliance with programme management and business support. This includes supporting the next Alliance Summit on the 1st November at Cobham Sports & Social Club in Merley.

The Alliance and Here For Each Other - Wellnet are jointly hosting this Autumn Summit with a focus on staff wellbeing. The Summit will provide an insight into how staff are feeling and coping in Dorset's general practices. There will be a range of experts who will present a variety of workshops on how to identify and reduce stress, enhance



wellbeing and develop a positive workplace culture including the Here for Each Other service, Drs in Distress, Richard House and a time for you session.

Training

Another successful PLT session was delivered and covered by our call handler, Annie Morris and locum GP on Tuesday 5th September.

The next date and time is Thursday 30th November from 1.30-4.30pm.

GP cover for this session is already in place and the Protocol will be circulated ahead of that date in due course. Castleman has recently put in place respiratory training for 11 practice nurses to upskill in spirometry performance and interpretation at no cost to either practice or candidate. This will enable spirometry to be delivered at practice level although Castleman RSN Steph Norton will continue to offer support where needed.

Castleman has also been working on a training plan for practices and this is a work in progress. Further details to follow soon.
